The main objectives of the show are to make a viewer to feel comforted, relaxed and in a care-

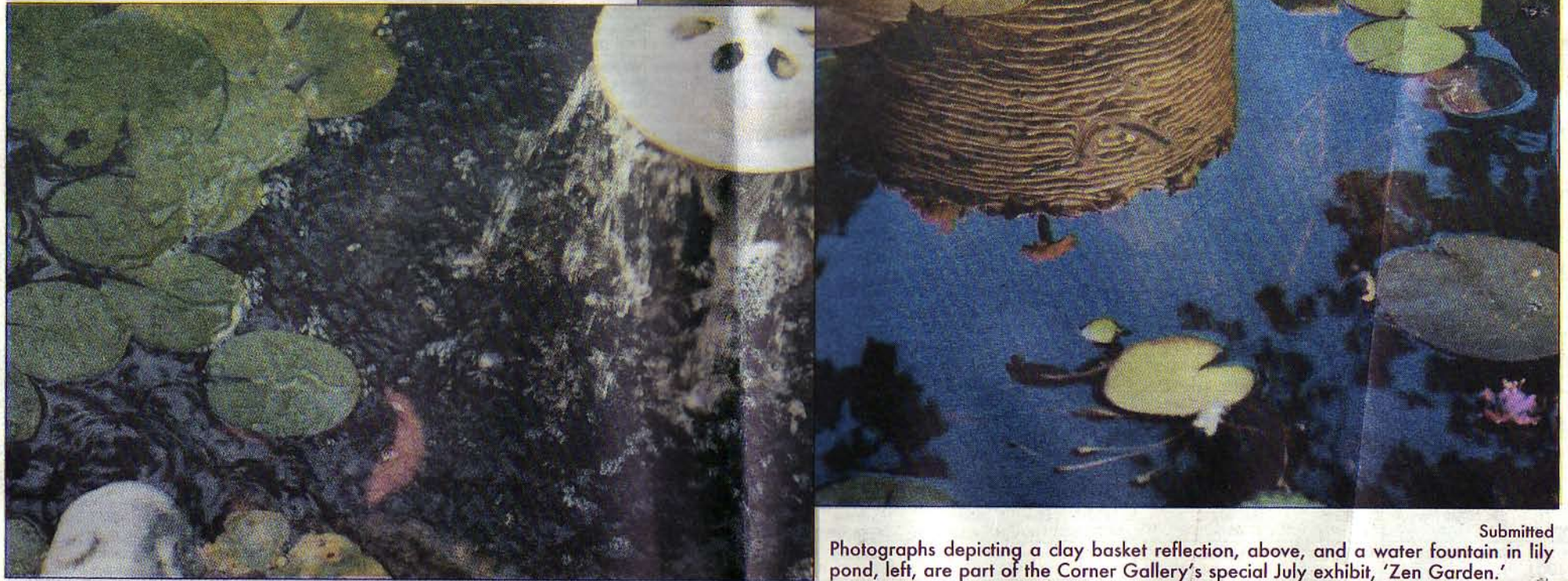
free state of mind when she or he enters the room. In order to make the room peaceful, she has used a lot of lights coming through paper. She also used some sound effects.
